From the Principal

All families of students attending Booleroo Centre District School and the Kindergarten in 2017 and who use one of the six buses to get here need to have returned agreements for bus use by Thursday 1st December please.

We use these to determine numbers on buses, to ascertain any changes if necessary to bus capacity and or routes. To reaffirm; all high aged school students have BCDS as their school of right for the bus runs and primary aged students who live closest to BCDS and no other primary have BCDS as their school of right. Kindy children have next rights to a bus seat to access BCDK. Primary aged students who live closer to another primary school must apply for a bus bypass; these may be granted in agreement with the local primary and BCDS and only with understanding that if bus seats are required for students of right then this agreement is negated.

As 2017 curriculum begins in week 8 this term absent exemptions will not be agreed with the expectation that all students Reception to Year 11 attend. Information for families that whilst curriculum delivery has finished for our year 12 students they remain enrolled so that they are able to attend events such as the end of year formal. The last official day of school is Friday 16th December. We trust that the Year 12 students and families enjoy the dinner planned by Blake McCallum and Georgie Phillips this Friday at the Ballroom of the Keith Michell Theatre.


