During Term 3 Science, we have been investigating daily and seasonal changes in the environment. We have observed and recorded occurrences such as weather and seasonal changes to plants such as the colour and appearance of their leaves.
To end our unit, we created an artwork representing a cherry blossom tree in the Springtime. It was fitting as we ended our last week of term in Spring! Firstly, we created our tree by tracing a template onto brown paper and cutting it out. Next was to put on our blossoms. To do this, we used little ear buds creating an array of colours that depict a cherry blossom tree's blooming flower.


For number this term in Maths, we have been looking at place value. Using concrete materials such as the base ten blocks has been helpful for us to visualise the numbers that we are making and learn the place value of each numeral. We have become quite confident mathematicians showing Miss Foulis and Ms Crawford our numbers and how we represent them using base ten blocks!
