While NAPLAN results offer valuable insights, they are just one piece of the puzzle in assessing students' literacy and numeracy levels. Teachers rely on various assessments and observations to form a comprehensive understanding of each student's educational journey.
It's crucial to understand that NAPLAN results don't determine the overall quality of a school. They serve as a tool to complement teachers' assessments and provide additional information for discussions about students' strengths and areas for improvement.

Parents and caregivers are encouraged to use NAPLAN reports alongside other school assessment reports when engaging in conversations with teachers about their child's progress. These discussions are essential for fostering collaboration and supporting each student's individual learning needs.
If you have any questions or would like to discuss NAPLAN further, please don't hesitate to reach out to your child's teacher or myself. We're here to support you every step of the way.

## Governing Council

Governing Councils play a vital role in steering the direction of a school or preschool, working collaboratively with the site leader, whether it's a principal or director. These councils convene regularly to discuss and monitor the strategic direction of the site, ensuring it aligns with the needs of the community.
